The National Association of Boys & Girls Clubs (NABGC) Boxing Championships are contested in accordance with the rules, directives, policies and procedures as laid out by the host nation. NABGC are not a governing body and only act as the organiser of the championships. **All rules governing the sporting aspect, except that of the entry criteria as laid out below, are governed by the host nations as recognised by World Boxing. These are, England Boxing, Welsh Boxing, Boxing Scotland, Irish Athletic Boxing Association. A boxer can only enter the championship via an NABGC Associated Organisation in which their registered club must be a member of. Entrants must have completed the entry form in accordance with their NABGC Associated Organisations process. The NABGC Boxing Championships commence at the initial weigh in.

1. Laws

- i. The NABGC championships shall be contested in accordance with the rules, directives, policies and procedures as laid out by the host nation. E.g. England Boxing Ltd.
- ii. All boxers must weigh in dressed in shorts and vest or singlet.
- iii. A Weight Allowance will be applied to **Class A & B** boxers only from the Quarter Finals onwards.

2. Boxer Eligibility

- i. All entrants must have competed in a minimum of **TWO** recorded amateur boxing contests before entering the Championships.
 - ii. All entrants must have held their boxing registration with their home nation for a minimum period of one year after their initial medical.
 - iii. An entrant **MUST NOT** have represented their country in the Commonwealth Championships, European Championships, World Championships or equivalent at junior or youth level.
 - iv. An entrant **MUST NOT** have competed in a professional contest.
 - v. The boxers date of birth **MUST** fall within the dates published on the entry form for the class they have entered.
3. **Affiliation.** Entrants may only enter through one NABGC Associated Organisation and **MUST** be registered to a home nation affiliated boxing club.
 4. **Awards.** A boxer may only be awarded the National Title if they have boxed at an earlier stage of the competition.
 5. **Equipment.** *A boxer shall wear only equipment (head guards, hand wraps and gloves) that is certified by the relevant home nation that the boxer is competing in. Such as, but not limited to, Sting or Adidas. Boxers weighing 65kg and under must wear 10oz gloves. Boxers weighing over 65kg must wear 12oz gloves.
 6. **Duration of bouts.** *All Class A & B bouts will be contested over 3x2 minute rounds. All Class C & D bouts will be contested over 3x3 minute rounds.
 7. **Seconds.** The number of accredited seconds/coaches (who are qualified and registered) is **three** per club.
 8. **Replacements.** Should any winner (from regional round onwards) withdraw before the day of the next stage, the runner-up may be invited to go forward at the discretion of NABGC. If, however, the winner fails to make the weight or medical on the day, the opponent shall be awarded a walkover.
 9. **Expenses.** Travelling expenses of officials shall be paid in accordance with the scale set out by the National Association of Boys & Girls Clubs. No claim for competitors' travel shall be accepted at any round of the championship.
 10. **Disputes.** The interpretation of this Criteria and Guidance document and any other matter relating to these championships will be decided by NABGC in conjunction with the Technical Delegate/Supervisor.
